• • Recent Council Items of Interest • •

Council accepted (5-0) 10/1/19 the 2018 **SAFER grant to hire 12 firefighters**. The city authorized the Fire Department to apply for the grant on May 7, 2018. Our Fire Department applied on March 22, 2019 and on September 18, 2019, the department received notification that the grant has been awarded for the period of March 11, 2019 – March 10, 2023. SAFER is a cost-sharing grant with a three-year performance period, and eligible costs include salary and benefits and fire academy training.

Council voted (5-0) 10/22/19 to accept two grants from the San Diego Association of Governments to help with the **2020 Census**. The Chula Vista Elementary School District and Chula Vista Community Collaborative will be reaching out in **Hard to Count** areas of Chula Vista, including **much of Northwest and Southwest Chula Vista**.

Council voted (5-0) 10/22/19 to **revise public facilities development impact fees** (PFDIFs), which include the following seven components: Civic Center Expansion, Police Facilities and Equipment, Corporate Yard Relocation, Libraries, Fire Suppression System, PFDIF Program Administration, and Major Recreational Facilities. The following components were eliminated: Geographic Information System (GIS), Computer Systems, Telecommunications Systems and Records Management. Council heard (10/22/19) a **Public Safety Staffing report**, which gives guidelines and recommendations for FY 2020 – 2025 for public safety staffing. The Chula Vista Police Department maintains 0.92 officers per 1,000 residents as of September 2019. In order to catch up to the other city in the county with the lowest ratio of sworn officers to residents (Carlsbad), **beyond Measure A, we will need to hire 19 sworn and 3 civilian support positions** in the next five years, which will cost an additional \$3M per year. Our Fire Department is continuing to evaluate the effect of squads, planning 4-0 staffing at fire stations that are currently not 4-0, the assessment of providing transport services, and staffing due to future developments such as the Bayfront. *Click [here](#) to read the staff report and presentation. Council heard (10/22/19) the balanced budget plan presentation and **Outlook for Fiscal Years 2021 – 2023** by Finance Director David Bilby. **The net takeaway is that our forecasted deficit is \$7.19 million next year (FY2021), \$11.87 million (FY2022), and \$12.73 million (FY2023).** *Click [here](#) to read the staff report and presentation. On October 21st, 2019, SeaWorld Entertainment and Sesame Workshop (Sesame Street®) revealed that Chula Vista will be the location of a new Sesame Place® theme park. 
