Spring has arrived in our beloved Chula Vista as we welcome March and enjoy all that our city has to offer.



DID YOU VOTE? **The Presidential Primary Election** is today, March 3rd, 2020. Find your polling place [here](#). Note that the registrar of voters has up to 30 days after an election to count absentee and provisional ballots that had arrived to their facility on or before election day and certify results.

• • Recent Council Items of Interest • •

Council voted (5-0) 02/25/20 to evaluate options and alternatives that could **help combat the teenage vaping epidemic** that has hooked almost 30% of high school students on compact, portable, high-nicotine e-cigarettes like **Juul and Puff Bar**. Council voted (5-0) 02/25/20 to allow for a **University and Innovation overlay zone**. The new regulatory tool will allow flexibility in the event that a future university should prefer to expand or swap land in the current 375 acres with land outside of the designated university space. The timeline for the next steps are: Spring/Summer 2020: draft the specific UI Overlay Zone and SPA Amendments; Summer/Fall 2020: draft Overlay Zone ordinance, bringing them forward to the Planning Commission and Council hearings; Summer/Fall 2020: Partnership agreement with HomeFed; and.... 2021 (hope): Phase 1 ground-breaking for a University or “University catalyst” user.

Council voted (4-1) 2/18/20 to amend the **City Attorney’s Budget to fund a new paralegal and new investigator position**. The City Attorney’s original proposal was to fund these two positions using Measure A funds, but after working with our finance department, the City Attorney’s office identified areas that it could reduce outside attorney’s fees, bill against other non-general fund sources, and effect salary savings in order to fund these two new positions. *I voted against the two new positions because they were staffed on the promise of future savings and billing, and not actual savings/billing.*

Council voted (5-0) 2/18/20 to transfer 284 residential units from Village 8 East to Village 8 West, and redistribute commercial and park spaces, extend an internal street to connect to the future Greenbelt Trail and Otay Ranch South Park. **The hopes for a middle school at the Otay Ranch Village 8 site did not materialize**, but there is still land available in other planning areas should the SUHSD express interest. Meanwhile, the CVESD has expressed interest in expanding charter elementary schools to middle schools. *Read more [here](#).*

The next city council meeting is Tuesday, March 3rd, at 5pm, Chula Vista City Council Chambers, 276 4th Avenue. Council meetings are generally the first four Tuesdays of the month. Agendas are posted the Thursday prior to each meeting. *To view the agenda, click [here](#).*

City council meetings can be viewed live on television on Cox Cable channel 24 (only in Chula Vista) or AT&T U-Verse channel 99 (anywhere in the county), via live-streaming on your computer, tablet, or smart phone.

The Chula Vista Public Library hosted 2,294 programs in 2019 that were attended by 70,620 people of all ages! 424 meetings were held in library conference rooms. 20,731 passports were processed, 5,005 passport photos were taken. 8,820 people visited the library workforce development stations. 489 volunteers donated 19,180 hours of their time at our library branches. This spring, the library will be launching new high-speed, unlimited data circulating wifi hotspots.

If you are looking for a book that our library does not own, you can have it mailed to you via Amazon, and the library will add it to the collection when you return it. *Ask at your branch for more details.*


