Recent Council Items of Interest

<u>Council voted (5-0) 11/12/19 and 11/19/19</u> to comply with State Law, Senate Bill SB 13, which **suspends the owner occupancy requirement** for Accessory Dwelling Units and Junior Accessory Dwelling Units across the entire state of California. Our municipal code has been modified to read: "This Section 19.58.023(B)(2) shall be held in abeyance until January 1, 2025,' and "This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force on January 1, 2020."

Council voted (5-0) 11/12/19 to increase the line of credit for the **Bayfront Project Special Tax Financing District** from \$125M maximum to \$175M maximum. Bond revenues are necessary to fund infrastructure improvements on the Chula Vista Bayfront, including the new Harbor Park and Sweetwater Park, street improvements (E, F, G, H Streets), sewer pump station, utility corridor, and other improvements. The Special Tax Financing District will be paid

back with Transient Occupancy Taxes (TOT) from hotels in the district and the RV Park, incremental property tax revenues, Port revenues, and other sources.

<u>Council voted (5-0) 11/12/19</u> to review and process a **pre-annexation analysis** funding agreement for consideration by the San Diego Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) of a 23.8 acre parcel from Chula Vista to the city of San Diego. The "Nankano Site" is **between the Otay Valley Regional Park and Palm Avenue**, east of the 805.

<u>Council voted (5-0) 11/19/19</u> to extend the **tree maintenance agreement** with West Coast Arborist from \$950K to \$1.7M for the remaining two (1) year contract extension periods. There were unanticipated tree maintenance services during the first three years of the contract, including pest infestations, emergencies and hazard removals, tree root issues, and broken and fallen limbs after weather events.

<u>Council watched a presentation 11/19/19</u> on the construction plans for the **replacement/move of Fire Station 9, to just south of the San Diego Country Club**. The new fire station requires the closure of portions of Moss Street and Alpine Avenue and a new traffic signal at the intersection of Naples and Alpine. <u>Council heard a presentation 11/19/19</u> on the state of the city's **20A electrical utility undergrounding program.** The city receives \$2.0M per year from SDG&E as a result of a settlement agreement to underground utility lines. Roughly \$20M was used to underground the high voltage utility lines on the Bayfront. Councilmember Padilla reminded us that the remaining power lines on the bayfront are to be undergrounded using future tenant improvements, not the city's negotiated 20A settlement funds. Our current account balance is approximately \$6.1M. An estimated \$2.9-\$3.2M is reserved for the F Street promenade power lines from Bay Boulevard to Broadway. *To review the presentation, click here.*

City council meetings can be viewed live on television on Cox Cable channel 24 (only in Chula Vista) or AT&T U-Verse channel 99 (anywhere in the county), via live-streaming on your computer, tablet, or smart phone.

Do You Know

When your street will be swept next?

Chula Vista streets are swept once every other month. Street sweepers pick up an average of **2,000 – 3,000 pounds of debris per shift**. On designated street sweeping days, please move parked cars to your driveways during working hours. You can click <u>here</u> to see a map of street sweeping areas.

Below is the schedule for Northwest District 2 street sweeping areas:

Northwest District 2: Bayfront to 4th Avenue, G Street north to National City, swept on the first Monday of odd months

North Central District 2: 4th Avenue to the 805, G Street north to National City, swept on the first Monday of even months

Terranova: 805 to Terranova (plus Rancho Del Rey/District 1), north of H Street, swept on the third Friday of even months

Southwest District 2: Bayfront to 4th Avenue, between G Street & L Street, swept on the third Monday of odd months

Central District 2: 4th Avenue to 805 J Street to G Street, plus a section J to L Street between 3rd & 4th Ave, swept on the third Monday of even months

South Central District 2: 3rd Ave to the 805, J Street to L Street (and south to Naples/District 4), swept on the third Tuesday of odd months

Halecrest Neighborhood: 805 to Paseo del Rey, between H Street and Telegraph Canyon, swept on the <u>first Friday of odd months</u>
